Public Access Computer Use Policy

Approved January 13, 1997  
Updated 20 July 2005

In response to advances in technology and the changing needs of the community, the Marstons Mills Public Library endeavors to develop collections, resources, and services that meet the informational, educational, cultural, and recreational needs of Marstons Mills village's diverse community.

In keeping with its mission and with advances in information technology, the Library provides users with access to the information services of the CLAMS (Cape Library Automated Materials Sharing) network and to the Internet. The Internet is a global electronic network that provides dynamic resources and facilitates communication. Library staff cannot control access points that often change rapidly and unpredictably. Users are hereby notified that they are responsible for the choice of sites that they visit. All users shall assume full liability, legal, financial or otherwise for their actions on the public access computers.

As with other materials, restriction of a child's access to CLAMS automated databases and to the Internet is the responsibility of parents or legal guardians.

The Marstons Mills Public Library makes no warranty, expressed or implied, for the timeliness, accuracy or usefulness of information accessed via the Internet.

Users must comply with the United States copyright law and all other applicable laws.

Access to the Internet is provided by the Library and the Massachusetts Board of Library Commissioners, who agreed to guarantee access to all residents of Massachusetts through provision of the necessary hardware.

The Marstons Mills Public Library does not offer electronic mail or usenet accounts.
